


ROAD DEPARTMENT WINTER TIPS

The Chestnuthill Township Road Department has been working diligently throughout the year to prepare for the snowy winter ahead. They have been maintaining the roads in the Township, and will be taking care of them throughout the winter season.

SNOW REMOVAL

To the right you can see a diagram that shows the correct way to remove snow from your driveway. This will not only help make clearing snow from the roads easier, but it will also help everyone stay safe. Regarding safety, it is important to note that shoveling your driveway snow into the roadway isn't just wrong it is also a violation of the Township Code. **Shoveling snow into the road puts other drivers at risk and could result in a fine for you, so just dont do it.**




TOWNSHIP ROAD RIGHTS OF WAY

The Chestnuthill Township Road Department's primary responsibility during a snow or ice event is to safely and efficiently clear, open and maintain the township roadways. Vehicles and garbage/recycling containers left in the road rights-of-way create a hazard for residents and our crew. They also negatively impact the departments ability to provide the snow plowing service to all municipal streets. Therefore, we ask that all vehicles and containers remain out of the municipal rights-of-way. If a container is damaged during a storm it is at the expense of the owner, if a vehicle is left within the Township Road Rights-of-Way during an ice or snow event they will be ticketed and/or towed at the Owner's Expense.



MAILBOX NOTICE



Every winter the Township receives numerous calls regarding damaged mailboxes. Please be advised that mailboxes must be mounted no less than 4 feet from the edge of the pavement. This measurement is from the face of the mailbox. Any mailbox installed less than this distance is the responsibility of the property owner should any damage occur to the mailbox during a snow plowing event. Additionally, in order to receive mail delivery following a snow event, mailboxes must be shoveled out by the resident per the United States Postal Service. We appreciate your cooperation with this regulation.
